FRAME AND WIRE REQUIREMENTS:

Photographs **must** be properly framed and wired:

- 1. The screw eye should be placed in the $\frac{1}{100}$ to $\frac{1}{100}$ section from the top of frame.
- 2. The wire must not extend above the top of the piece
- 3. No sawtooth hangers.
- 4. Frames must be sturdy and in good hanging condition.
- 5. Glass must be clean and free of finger prints.
- 6. Unfortunately, artwork not properly wired and framed will not be accepted.
- 7. Maximum size is 40" x 40"

AWARDS:

- 1. This show will be juried. $1^{st} 3^{rd}$ and one HM will be awarded based on the actual work.
- 2. Awards will be announced and presented at the reception.
- 3. Prizes: 1st: \$100, 2nd \$75, 3rd \$50, Honorable Mention \$25
